
## Kindergarten 2018

# Mathletics and Reading Eggs Top 10

We will be publishing the top 10 Mathletics and Reading Eggs students in each fortnight.

The Top 10 Mathletics lists are devised from the students with the most Mathletics points for the fortnight. Students receive Mathletics points by completing Mathletics learning tasks. All students who achieve more than 1000 points within a week receive a Mathletics award in class.

The Top 10 Reading Eggs lists are selected from students who regularly use the program and complete 'maps' with accuracy. Students go to a new map each time they complete 10 levels. All students who complete a 'map' receive a Reading Eggs awards in class.
