# **Literacy and Numeracy**

# Stage 1: KC Interactive Writing Learning Experience

KC has been developing their writing skills through engaging in interactive writing lessons each day. Students are actively participating in the writing process and work together to compose and write a simple or complex sentence about a given topic. The students are called upon to identify and record initial and final sounds, search for words in dictionaries and recognise how many parts are in a multisyllabic word. ### Stage 3: Literacy and Numeracy

In Stage 3 we have a wide variety of learning activities, which include explicitly taught elements such as: Spelling Mastery and 'Envision' mathematics program.

The students also engage in cooperative learning activities related to literacy units, which include: writing, reading, and responding activities. We are currently doing a unit of work called 'Heroes and Villains' which is exploring the life of Ned Kelly and requires students to form an opinion as to where he sits on the hero to villain continuum. What would your opinion be?

In numeracy students engage in practical activities to illustrate mathematical aspects. For example for fractions we used blocks, magnets, concrete materials, and written follow up activities to reinforce the theory. *Mrs White*

# NAPLAN 2018 and beyond

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Planning has begun to move NAPLAN from a pen and paper assessment to an online assessment. A fact sheet is available for parents and carers to help understand the transition process.

NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test will be held at Southern Cross School K-6 between 14th August and 22nd September this year, led by Mrs Piccoli and Miss Tuck.

# **Changes to Administration**

Southern Cross School K-6 will transition to the new NSW Public Schools' finance system and a new bank account on **4th September 2017.** 

To ensure a smooth transition, there will be changes to the way we accept payments from parents and carers.

### **Direct deposits:**

As of 18th August 2017, we will no longer accept direct deposits into our current school bank account as we prepare to close this account and transition to the new one. Any payments made using direct deposit after this date cannot be properly allocated to a student's account in a timely manner. Please ensure you have made any outstanding direct deposits before 18th August 2017.

#### **EFTPOS** payments:

We will not be able to accept EFTPOS payments between 25th August and 6th September 2017. Please ensure that you have made any outstanding EFTPOS payments before 25th August, 2017. From 6th September 2017, EFTPOS payments will be accepted as before.

### Cash and cheque payments:

Between 29th August 2017 and 6th September 2017, we will also not be able to accept payments by cash or cheque as we prepare to close our current bank account and transition to the new one. Please ensure that you have made any outstanding cash or cheque payments before 29th August 2017. (From 6th September 2017, cash and cheque payments will be accepted as before).

# Online payments (make a payment tab on Website):

As of **25th August 2017**, payments to our current online payment facility will cease. You will not be able to use the Department of Education's Parent Online Payment (POP) system until **Wednesday 6th September**.

# **Partners in Learning Parent Survey**

# Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability - NCCD

Our school is participating in the collection of nationally consistent data on school students with disability.

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (the national data collection) is an annual collection that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment due to disability and the level of reasonable adjustment they are receiving. Reasonable adjustments reflect the assessed individual needs of the student, and are provided in consultation with the student and/or their parents and carers. Reasonable adjustments can be made across the whole school setting (e.g. ramps into school buildings), in the classroom (such as adapting teaching methods) and at an individual student level (e.g. extra tuition for a student with learning difficulties).

This information will help teachers, principals, education authorities and families to better support students with disability to take part in school on the same basis as other students. Please see the attached Fact Sheet for more information about the process.
